With Bethia Thomas's help access for the bus stop on the Swindon side has been improved with the removal of the old bus stop pole.	
Oxfordshire County Council's (OCC) Highways Engagement Team met with the Chairman and Clerk to look at road issues in the parish. Following the meeting: • a loose dropped curve has been repaired	
 the cracks in the road between Littleworth and Thrupp are scheduled for repair in March 	
 the Highways Operations Team have looked at the water flowing across the road near Park Farm and believe there may be an existing drain which could be used the Placemaking Team are looking at the challenges pedestrians face when crossing the A420 from a road safety perspective 	
The parish Meeting contacted our Local MP, Charlie Maynard, regarding road safety of pedestrians trying to cross the A420 to use the bus. Our MP has asked that we keep him appraised of the recommendations from OCC.

 Local council boundaries - there is a recommendation with parliament to change the boundaries for the 2027 local elections. If agreed Littleworth would become part of the Kingston Bagpuize ward, together with Hinton Waldrist, Longworth, Pusey and Fyfield & Tubney.
